

Crochet Snowflake Granny Square Pattern

Materials You'll Need

Before you embark on your crochet snowflake granny square adventure, make sure you have the following materials at hand:

- 1. Yarn: Choose a color that complements your winter theme. White or light blue yarn works well for snowflakes, while you can pick any color for the granny square background.
- 2. Crochet Hooks: Select a hook size suitable for your chosen yarn. Typically, a 4mm or 5mm hook will work well for worsted weight yarn.
- 3. Scissors
- 4. Yarn Needle for weaving in ends
- 5. Stitch Markers (optional)

Snowflake Granny Square Dimensions: Approximately 12 x 12 centimeters.

Common Crochet Stitch Abbreviations:

- ch: chain
- sc: single crochet
- sl st: slip stitch
- dc: double crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- sp: space

Crochet Snowflake Granny Square Pattern: Create a delicate white snowflake using color A:

Round 1: Start with a magic ring. Chain 3, then work 15 double crochets (dc) into the magic ring. Join with a slip stitch to the top of the initial chain-3.

Round 2: Chain 5, double crochet into the same stitch. Skip the next stitch, then *work* [double crochet, chain 2, double crochet] in the following stitch. Skip the next stitch, and repeat this pattern until you reach the end of the round. Join with a slip stitch.

Round 3: Slip stitch into the chain-2 space. In the same space, work [chain 3, double crochet, chain 3, 2 double crochets]. *In the next chain-2 space, work* [2 double crochets, chain 3, 2



double crochets]. Repeat this pattern until the end of the round. Join with a slip stitch.

Round 4: Slip stitch, then slip stitch into the chain-2 space. In the same space, work [chain 3, 2 double crochets, chain 3, 3 double crochets]. *In the next chain-2 space, work [3 double crochets, chain 3, 3 double crochets].* Continue this pattern until you reach the end of the round. Join with a slip stitch.

Round 5: Slip stitch, then slip stitch into the chain-2 space. In the same space, work [chain 3, 3 double crochets, chain 2, 4 double crochets]. *In the next chain-2 space, work [4 double crochets, chain 2, 4 double crochets].* Repeat this pattern until the end of the round. Join with a slip stitch and cut the yarn.

Now, create a blue border using color B:

Round 6: Attach the yarn into a chain-2 space. Work the following stitches: [chain 3, double crochet, chain 3, 2 double crochets], then 3 double crochets, 1 double crochet between the shells, double crochet, half double crochet, single crochet, slip stitch, single crochet, half double crochet, double crochet, 1 double crochet between the shells, and 3 double crochets. In the chain-2 space, work [2 double crochets, chain 3, 2 double crochets], then repeat the sequence from * to * until you reach the end of the round. Join with a slip stitch.

Round 7: Slip stitch, then slip stitch into the chain-2 space. In the same space, work [chain 3, double crochet, chain 3, 2 double crochets], followed by 6 double crochets and 7 single crochets. Then, work 6 double crochets, and continue with [2 double crochets, chain 3, 2 double crochets], 6 double crochets, 7 single crochets, and 6 double crochets. Repeat this pattern until the end of the round. Join with a slip stitch.
