

Granny Flower Coasters Free Pattern

Crafted through the art of crocheting or knitting, Granny Flower Coasters have garnered a devoted following among craft enthusiasts of varying expertise levels. The term “Granny” embedded within its name pays homage to the time-honored and traditional character of these coasters, reminiscent of the sort of handicrafts that might have been tenderly crafted by grandmothers in ages long past.

The “Flower” element of their designation alludes to the lavish floral motifs that grace the coaster’s surface, infusing it with a touch of gracefulness and femininity.

An option for decoration and gift



These delicate coasters can be personalized to match your decor or make beautiful gifts for family and friends. Whether to decorate your table at breakfast, or to give as a gift to a friend at work, this coaster is perfect.

Materials:

Aran / worsted weight cotton yarn (small quantities)

5mm crochet hook

Darning needle

Size:

Small coaster: approximately 4.5 inches in diameter (12cm)

Large coaster: 6.5 inches (17cm) in diameter

Abbreviations (US Terms, with UK Conversion):

sc (dc): Single Crochet (Double Crochet)

dc (tr): Double Crochet (Treble Crochet)

ch: Chain

sp: Space

st(s): Stitch(es)

sl st: Slip Stitch

Granny Flower Coasters Pattern:

Now, let's get into the pattern itself. These instructions will guide you through creating a Granny Flower Coaster. You can make as many as you like in different colors to match your decor.

Round 1: Begin by chaining 3 (counted as a double crochet), then work 11 double crochets into the ring. Join with a slip stitch to the top of the starting chain 3. (12 double crochets)



Round 1

Round 2: Introduce a new color by joining it in any space located between the stitches. Chain 3, work a double crochet in the same space, then repeat [work 2 double crochets in the next space] all the way around. Join with a slip stitch to the top of the initial chain 3. (24 double crochets)



Round 2

Round 3: Attach a new color in any space situated between groups of stitches. Chain 3, work 2 double crochets in the same space, followed by [work 3 double crochets] in the next space. Repeat this pattern around, and then join with a slip stitch to the top of the starting chain 3. (36 double crochets)



Round 3

Round 4: Secure a new color in any space between groups of stitches. Chain 3, work 2 double crochets in the same space, then chain 1. Continue by working [3 double crochets in the next space, followed by chaining 1] in repetition around. Join with a slip stitch to the top of the beginning chain 3. (36 double crochets, 12 chain-1 spaces)



Round 4

Round 5: Join a new color in any space, and chain 1 (this chain does not count as a stitch). Work 2 single crochets in the same space, then proceed to work 1 single crochet in each stitch. Additionally, work 2 single crochets in every chain-1 space. Finally, join with a slip stitch to the first single crochet of the round. (60 single crochets)



Conclusion

The Granny Flower Coasters pattern is not only a functional accessory for your home, but also a way to improve your crochet techniques. You can be inspired by this pattern and make it with different color tones and yarn textures, and that way I can try more options to use.
