

## Little Baby Dress Crochet



Crocheting is a timeless craft that allows you to express your creativity while making beautiful and functional items. One of the most charming and endearing crochet projects is the little baby dress. Whether you're a seasoned crocheter or a novice looking for a rewarding project, crafting a little baby dress is a delightful way to explore your skills and create a precious gift for a special little one.

In this article, we'll delve into the world of little baby dress crochet, exploring the materials you'll need, basic crochet techniques, and some design ideas to get you started.

### *Materials Needed:*

Approximately 250 yards of worsted weight (ww), aran, or bulky yarn

Crochet hook size H, or size I if you tend to crochet tightly

### *Finished Size:*

The finished dress or top will fit a newborn (NB) to a 3-month-old baby.

### *Gauge:*

To achieve the correct gauge, make sure that 5 rounds in the pattern stitch measure

approximately 4 inches. It's essential to crochet loosely to maintain the desired gauge.



*Special Stitches:*

Shell: (dc, ch1-3 times, dc) (dc, ch1-5 times, dc) (dc, ch1-6 times, dc)

Cluster: Work 3 dc in the same stitch or space, holding back the last loop on each, then yarn over and pull through all 4 loops on the hook.

*Notes:*

The number of double crochet (dc) stitches in each shell varies from round to round. You can increase the size of the dress by using a crochet hook two sizes or more larger. The heart pattern is not included in these instructions.

**Directions:**

Using the main color (MC), chain 62. Join to the beginning chain with a slip stitch, being careful not to twist the chain.

**Tutorial:**



**Round 1:** Ch1, sc in the 1<sup>st</sup> ch sp, \*sk2 chs, Shell [dc, ch1-3 times, dc] all in next ch sp, sk2 chs, sc in next sp\*. Repeat from \* around, join with a slst to first sc. (10 shells and 10sc)

**Round 2:** Ch4, (counts as dc, ch1 now and throughout) dc, ch1-4 times, dc in same sp, (shell made with 6dc and 5 ch1 sps), sk next ch1 sp, sc in next ch1 sp (of shell)sk next ch1 sp. \*In next sc make [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] Shell made, sk next ch1 sp, sc in next ch1 sp, sk next ch1 sp. \* Repeat from \* around, join with a slst to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg. ch4. (10 shells and 10 sc)

**Round 3:** Slst to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch1 sp of shell, ch1,\* [sc, ch2, sc] in same ch1 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] all in next sc, sk next 2-ch1 sps.\* Repeat from \* around, join with a slst to first sc. (10 shells and 10 sc, ch2, sc sps)



**Round 4:** {Armholes made this round} Slst into ch2 sp, ch4, dc, ch1-4 times, dc, all in same ch2 sp (shell made) sk2, ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp, sk next 2, ch1 sps, [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2 ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp, Ch5, sk next ch2 sp, sk next shell, sk next ch2 sp, on next shell-sk next 2 ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp (Armhole space made) sk next 2- ch1 sps, \*[dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2, ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp, sk next 2, ch1 sps.\* Repeat from \* 3 times (3 shells made on front of dress) Ch5, sk next ch2 sp, sk next shell, sk next ch2 sp, on next shell-sk next 2- ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp (Armhole space made) sk next 2- ch1 sps, [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2- ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp. Join with a slst to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg. ch4. (6 shells, 8 ch2 sps and 2- ch5 armhole sps)



Round 4

**Round 5:** Slst to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch1 sp, ch1, sc in same sp, ch2, sc all in same sp. Sk next 2-ch1 sps, Shell [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, Shell [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk 2 chs on Armhole, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch, sk next 2 chs. \*[dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2- ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp, sk next 2- ch1 sps\* Repeat \* 3 times total, Shell [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk 2 chs on Armhole, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch, sk next 2 chs. [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2 ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp, sk next 2- ch1 sps, [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] in last ch2 sp. Join with a slst to 1<sup>st</sup> sc. (8 shells and 8-ch2 sps)

**Round 6:** Slst into ch2 sp, ch4, [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] all in same space (*Shell made using 7dc and 6-ch1 sps*) \*sk next 2-ch1 sps, [sc, ch2, sc] in next ch1 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, [dc, ch1-6 times, dc] in next ch2 sp (*Shell made*),\* Repeat from \* around. Join with a slst to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg. ch4.

Now it gets easier,

**Round 7:** Slst into 3<sup>rd</sup> ch1 sp, ch1, sc in same sp, ch2, sk next dc, sc in next ch1 sp. Sk next 2-ch1 sps, Shell [dc, ch1-6 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, \*sc in next ch1 sp, ch2, sk next dc, sc in next ch1 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, Shell [dc, ch1-6 times, dc] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps,\* Repeat from \* around, join with a slst to 1<sup>st</sup> sc.



Round 7

**Round 8:** Slst into ch2 sp, ch4, [dc, ch1-5 times, dc] all in same space (*Shell made using 7dc and 6-ch1 sps*) \*sk next 2-ch1 sps, sc in next ch1 sp, ch2, sk next dc, sc in next ch1 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, [dc, ch1-6 times, dc] in next ch2 sp (*Shell made*),\* Repeat from \* around. Join with a slst to 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of beg. ch4.

**Round 9-14:** Repeat R7 and R8 for a total of 3 more times.

Begin Trim

**Round 15:** Slst into 3<sup>rd</sup> ch1 sp, ch1, sc in same sp, ch3, sk next dc, sc in next ch1 sp. Sk next 2-ch1 sps, Shell [tr, ch1-6 times, tr] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, \*sc in next ch1 sp, ch3, sk next dc, sc in next ch1 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps, Shell [tr, ch1-6 times, tr] in next ch2 sp, sk next 2-ch1 sps,\* Repeat from \* around, join with a slst to 1<sup>st</sup> sc.

**Round 16:** Slst into ch3 sp, ch1, sc in same sp, \* cluster (See Stitches) in next ch-1 sp, (ch 2, cluster in next ch1 sp) 5 times, sc in next ch3 sp\* Repeat from \* around, ending with a slst in first sc.

**Round 17:** Ch1, sc, ch3, sc all in same sp. \*[Sc, ch3, sc] in next ch2 sp, 5 times, [sc, ch3, sc] in next sc\* Repeat from \* around, join with a slst to first sc. Fasten off.
